Providing Services and Outreach to Our Most Vulnerable

Recently, you may have noticed an increase in unhoused neighbors in the district. The BID is sympathetic to their plight while also being cognizant of the impact of the blight created. To that end, we have had discussions with Colin Crews, current District Director and past Homelessness Director for Council District 12, to provide assistance.

Crews organized having the Homeless Outreach and Proactive Engagement (HOPE) team visit Old Granada Village and reach out to our unsheltered population. HOPE was developed by the LAPD Homeless Coordinator to improve the City's overall response to the complex and diverse needs of homeless residents and the communities in which they call home. The team partners with various departments connecting people to appropriate and much-needed services.

Streetscape Improvements

Last month, the BID completed the installation of an additional 16 litter receptacles throughout the district. These beautiful black and gold receptacles continue to further brand the district while serving a much-needed purpose. The old-world charm complements the style that has been created in Old Granada Village.

In November, an additional 8 decorative poles with hanging flower baskets (shown right) will be installed. Four more will be installed on Zelzah to create a more cohesive look and two each on Shoshone and Yarmouth. These lovely poles and colorful flower baskets have been such a wonderful addition to the streetscape plan.
